

London 8<sup>th</sup> Mo 8. 1845.

To Dr. G. F. Story  
My dear Friend:-

I am sorry some delay and consequently the dis-  
appointment has taken place in shipping off thy Books and  
clothes &c, which are now sent by "Horiga" Cap. Frankmore, in  
Case  no 213. on G. W. Walker's bill of Lading. I have deputed him to  
hand over this Case to J. B. Mather, as the whole of its contents are for  
thee and him: it is lined with tin: and insured to pay carriage for £75.  
I have written to J. B. Mather, so that I need not say any more about  
the rest of the contents.

In consequence of Pestum being Passenger in the "Deuwent", these Cases  
now sent, were left out of her: he had so many Goods: - I met (today)  
Cap H. J. <sup>formerly</sup> Burrey of the "Henry": he tells me he had his Goods left out both of  
the "Calcutta", and the "Deuwent": he deputed his love to thee and my Brother  
he says he is almost tired, I being among the stationary in the  
dry, and thinks most likely before long he may get in the port again,  
and come to Hobart Town.

Thou wilt be well aware that in carrying out the objects of  
the Royal Society of Bandiment Land &c, great expence will be  
incurred in the purchase of Books &c, as well as the specimens  
of natural History, Geology &c. If the Society wish any of the Linnean  
Society's Transactions, &c. to be purchased second hand (occasionally  
they are to be met with) (I think Jas Backhouse told me he was  
informed where a set ~~second hand~~ where to be sold) they had better  
send a definite order, and then of course they would be enquired  
for: - This year Curtis began a new series of their Magazine  
I have not yet made my mind up whether or not I shall send it:  
Whilst I think of it, when any Books are ordered if thou knowest  
the Publisher's name it is well to mention it.

Overleaf I have written the list of Books now sent, with the price  
at which they are sold: it is very difficult to get Books at any  
reduction from the Published price: Booksellers are very particular:  
15 pch. for Exportation, is the allowance, if they are satisfied it is so.

Stylich's Physical Description of New South Wales & V.D. Land I think is a very useful Book, and I mean to send thee another copy next time I send which I expect will not be long first, as I am preparing a Case of Books and Tracts for G. W. Walker: with it I think it probable I shall send thee a lot more Books: thou knowest I am quite ignorant of scientific matters, and must proceed slowly, for more reasons than one. I do not know at what price G. Don's Gardner's Dictionary is sold retail by the Publishers: it is still in their catalogue <sup>I suspect about the same price.</sup> I forgot to enquire, that there been past the door to day, being sent for just by: -- but I am just now attending to the shipment of Good's ~~Gifts~~ <sup>Gifts</sup> and have a great deal to think of. Lindley's Natural System of Botany is now being re-printed, but with some improvements, or alterations: I think thou ought to have it.

The Publisher of the Gardner's Chronicle may be said to have begun a new Series last year, by adding Agriculture, to Gardening (which is now sold in a volume.)

I have been desired to tell thee, there is published here, the "Medical Gazette": a similar one to the Lancet, but thought to be better: it commenced a new Series the 5<sup>th</sup> month of this

year: Our dear Friend James Bachhouse sent me a very good list of Books on Botany: but not I think near so full a list on Geology: so that I have consulted the Individual or two, on the subject: for Bachhouse mentioned "Ansted's Geology, 2 vols" which thou wilt see I have sent: the result of my enquiries is, that I am recommended to send ~~some more Books, than I have a list:~~ but as thou dost not say that thou art buying by order for the Society, I have thought I must be very careful at present: one of the Individuals is Librarian to the London Institution, Finsbury Circus: --

It is understood, all the Books sent out, are the latest editions. For Bachhouse wished the vol. of the British Association for 1844, to be sent as it contains some notice by Professor Owen, of the great Mammothian Bones, of Australia: with love I remain thy Friend
