My dear Father

I take the opportunity  
of writing to you by Mr Craig a few lines  
we are all well here at present and  
full of business but I am afraid Mr Graham  
will lose his situation as Mr Alley and  
Hamilton think him unfit for business  
I believe the young Mr Stewart will apply  
for his situation as he is recommended  
to Mr Hamilton by Mr Thomas At Mrs Lord's  
where I live I shall be obliged to leave they  
are so very irregular and the time she  
was away we had to get our meals  
the best way we could it seems as if  
I was very changeable but it is not  
my fault it is impossible for me to  
expect <sup>my</sup> meals ~~of~~ at one time and  
then to wait 2 hours for dinner as  
I have always to go in the evening

Mr. Adley is anxious to know how is Rams getting on as Mr. Cox told him to day that he should go and look at them in return wishes them to be got in good order and they may be then removed to Hermsides if you think it a more desirable place than Rosevale if the Rams are given up in a bad state there is a great danger of their not living for who do you find that will take care of any other persons stock who has no interest in it with best love to you all
