Dorchester Bank 30 July
1831

My dear Father

I have just time to write a few lines in return by Mr Gillis, to say that Mr. Locke of the firm of Clarke & Ladd, went up the country two days ago & will see your Bullocks, Mr Adley is still confined to bed with Rheumatic Gout, but he is out of danger; he has had a very severe turn, ^{and} Mr Adley has been very much alarmed for him, they had to fetch Mr Hamilton at 12 o'clock at night, as they expected he would have died, we have got some persons to assist us in the Bank, that I have not so much to do as I had before, and then it is a change to me, I am by no means well yet as after a days fatigue, I feel very tired, and then I am quite nervous, next morning, we have had it not the last three days, otherwise very seasonable weather, I hope you have got the Frowns they went by one Wilson a Carrier, and also your watch as the watchmaker gave it to Mr Fellicoe, I suppose you are as dull in the Country as we are in Town at present, but you must have some amusement in seeing your Bullocks getting fatter every day and Mr Gillis told me you were succeeding very well with your Garden & fruit tree he says he shall be glad to see the Muegerian again -
