

Dear Father Lannurton Feb 11th

 creasing business every day and have
 begun to bleed etc - so that I
 may expect a good run of business
 when I open - I had seven prescrip-
 tions from Dr Laudate besides
 selling about 6s worth of Medicine
 of my own prescribing - I re-
 ceiv'd My Bottles etc from Mr

Mr Good and would feel obliged
if you would let him know
I have put Couloms into the new
Glasses - which will about fill
the window sufficiently - as
soon as the Shop opens Dr S will
appoint his patients to meet
him at my place - so that
I shall have the preparing of
all his medicines - for at present
he occasionally dispenses some of
those that he has by him when
any thing is wanted immediately -
The Shop is very nearly completed
The Counter is all up - The
partition door and the heading
of the Drawers is about all

that remains - it is rather a tedious
job - as it requires a great deal
of nicety - but I shall remove
all the things in a day or two
so as to be ready the moment the
vessel arrives - I had a Carpenter
to make a wash stand Kitchen
Table with a bedstead for the
man to sleep in and to
put up some shelves in the
Kitchen this bill amounts to £4.12.0
and he asked me to let him have
it. I hoped to hear that you
were all well - I remain your
