

Dear Papa

May 3 1836

Since I have wrote you last I have
 paid Mr Henry 20£ and 2 18 to the
 Comptroller on Friday. — which makes
 up 43 — the order I sent
 home by the Lotus has come
 out. it amounts to 95. 12. —
 there are 12-17- of the Brewers Drags
 which I can sell of immediately —
 (a number of spirits amounting to 16 Gallons
 shall be sold to Dr Henry
 and see out — Mr Comptroller says it.
 I can sell any of them of and should
 you would guarantee a price for
 the remainder he would let me
 take them.

I have given Mr Blake a word
to provide himself with another
situation he is at present told
all the debts of last quarter
but I find it very difficult to
get much in - the business
has not been had lately owing
to the bad weather we have had
much sickness and I have
had a tolerable number of
patients - There is a
letter here for Mr G. G. G.
from Mr G. G. G. but none
for Arthur nor any papers
to Mrs Woodruff's friend last week
and my son to thank me
to the funeral which I attended
together with Lewis Wood
who was Fr. Gove

I received your potatoes so which
I am much obliged.

The Cook of Lat was taken to Fawcett
but he has not yet Embarked.

The Salt is all packed up in
a Steam Boat but follows
I got to tell Dr. Mr
it was ready for ^{at Fawcett} him
Mr. my he went out.

I will send it either by boat
or when the other comes
again. Hoping you are all
well I remain
