July 26th 1834 -

My dear father

I wrote last p. to Mr. White
having given the letter to post
hands I was not sure about its coming
to hand now -

I have had a conversation with
Mr. Eyer who brought the sheep over
land from N.S.W. he brought 1000
wethers only but 4 he wants coming
with not take less than 4.5/ If he does
not get it he will take them.

We have had two days good rain
it will do me £50 of good and the
best grass growing.

I hope Ed with delay is little
time as possible in coming over
I want him to help ^{me} as I can get
upwards of 1000 sheep to take.

He will not do wrong by bringing
3000 horses over two stock horses
I have work for two - he would
be able to get them in 90k at £25-
horses have a very high price
here £70 and £80 - but they are
also dear - dear they may be some
what cheaper in three months as a
great many cattle are on the road
from Sydney Mr. Gye brought 600
head.

I have bought 1000 frothed
weddars at 25/ each 4 months bill
having 10 per cent interest I expect to get
40/ each piece they are some
of the best but over.

I am offered 1400 Ewes lambs
at 31/ six months credit I expect
to get 40/ each

Like imported Ewes 4 months have
bill at £2 in the colony 12 months
£25 - Weddars above sheep 30/

\$40,000 have been paid in the
Colonial Treasury here within the
last six weeks an excitement
in taking Special Bonds they
will leave themselves no care to
be stuck with one survey as been
demanded at Port Grenada it will
be taken for the sake of a Town
it is taken by a Co of 50 individuals
the W. L. Co intend sending some live
stock over to St. Lucia offered
to act as agent for them in selling
them to which I have doubt in finding
a good market for
