My Dear Father

We have not received any letters from home since Charles wrote. Though some reports have arrived from the Greeny thing here, in my oak Mr. Tye has returned his account of the country is very bad nothing but dirt he got Mr. King George's land -

I have not heard from Messrs R. Connolly & Co. Lancaster. I shall most likely be obliged to stick my nose to London - for I wish not run the risk I did last year - we shall show about 5,000 including bank -

the state it being agricultural land

We have plenty of grass and I think
Hien with the good crop this year
as we have had a good deal of
rain.

We have had a long time squatter
and have done very little good
only bringing up the sheep with
I had sold my sheep when I first
came in the Colony - it was a
bad stock coming to the
or having anything to do with it
and the only chance we have
of doing any good ^{now} is by keeping on
for two or three years longer, for
now I do not think our sheep would
fetch 10/ each at home.

I believe our Government are going to
grant Squatter Licences ~~with~~ it will
be a very good thing for the country.

I have a great wish to come over
to see you and send I shall endeavour
to do so next summer.
