Dear Father

I take the opportunity of  
writing by Griffiths. I want distinctly  
understand from W. Hiskett when he will be  
ready to start. I think he is well shaken,  
a thing which he does not altogether ap-  
prove of. He is the failing of getting  
dizzy after dinner - when he gets  
away comes

I have seen a Mr. Leonard who is a  
partner of Seal House he seems  
obliging man. He is seen by Cross  
Phillips and someone again in the <sup>little</sup>

Tuckermans she describes it as a fine country  
or farm as he can judge. The Sheep House  
with being is plenty of water. He is settled  
on the wester side which he says is the  
best side. I have not seen Betman  
yet. He is expected from Melmond  
shortly. I wish endeavour to see him  
before I go. The Atlantic sail today with  
sheep. The vessel only was week with sheep  
the Tuckermans in three weeks or more.  
I am glad to hear that the party over of  
kind is awarded to you. I am tired of talking  
in connection. If I had known Mr. G. he  
would have been so long. I would have  
taken my passage in the Atlantic. I may now  
go in the first ship that sails. The vessel does  
the voyage direct and will soon
