

Wm. Frank  
August 22<sup>nd</sup> 1841

My Dear Sister

Having bought Mr. Atkins  
shop and fixtures for £300  
3750 slup 4 boxes of tobacco 3 amp stow  
88 then sum - He wishing to be  
paid by a bill of Exchange in  
W.L.C. I have drawn upon you  
for the amount (£321 10) at Ten  
days sight

I have told Mr. the banker we  
left near Adelaide and as also  
received the cash from you I wish  
to him 3 weeks ago to send all  
up in Adelaide and commit  
the cash to you. To place in  
one of the Lancaster Banks  
for us so that we may give  
cheques ~~on~~ Cheques on Adelaide  
are at account in ~~W.L.C.~~  
it will be better for us to have  
our funds either in Lancaster  
or Melbourne with this is a

Bank in Portland or Rivoli Bay  
If Mr. Arthur should present the  
bill ~~you~~ before I'll remit the  
money you wish ~~down~~ as the promise  
to accept it I'll wish have  
about £1000 in Australia  
He will have to pay accounts  
I'll see to the amount of £300  
and the rest he will send to  
you; to place to our credit in  
one of the safe Banks in Lancaster  
by the first vessel -

I shall have a good deal of  
business with the Bank for  
I expect to have to send the  
wool ~~home~~ to London we shall  
share - 17000 sheep and lambs

I received a letter from G. O. the  
states your working to know where  
we are I am settled on the business  
of South Australia ~~between~~ <sup>joining</sup> ~~the~~  
Australian Felix on the sea coast  
Port Phillip is the station I bought  
from Mr. Arthur and Lake George  
is our head station about 90 miles  
from Portland -

The sold the mutton in Adelaide  
at 3/6, 300 he sold at 1/11  
I expect he will join me in a  
few weeks - we have a very  
good overseer in Mr McIntyre who  
was with Mr Anselm

Mr Charles Shoolan tells the  
country here is a good opening  
for him. That is - ~~if~~ he could  
get 2 pairs I would advise  
him to come and look first  
if he brought a good horse or two  
equal to 15 shillings they would set  
him up with blood - I want to  
purchase two good geldings  
though we have 2 horses we have  
not a horse equal to our weight  
they being heavy and fat

The two Mr Arthurs are nephews  
of Mr G Arthurs they go to Vicks  
from this in  
with their own tools  
Home
