My Dear Father

I have just arrived
 in Palmer - to the boat
 shipping my wool - and got
 some bits mounted to my
 my shavers - I am obliged to
 know how. I am in conversation with
 with Mr. and Ed - as I
 am not aware you have
 sent the £500 - the value
 he does thing in about a
 fortnight we have got
 a good clip and wool
 But what expect this
 clip will come to £6000
 of above -

I wrote you I would like to
at 1/2 ak over washed -
I wish had you some things
I have also come down to look
for boys. We shall be able
to get our wool down - early
from what I see of the results.
They are opening up in Scotland.
Advance - The wool has
been much got up in the
Perthshire District - It is
taking every pains - we
have 20 shewings -

The Government are surveying
land in my neighbourhood
by application I am afraid the
Bishop of Adelaide is going

to invest in land. I should not
like my land gathered up by
buying 1000 acres - it would
be because the ^{best part} ~~land~~ for 5 years -
it would pay me to buy - had
then the land would be
worth the money or more -
when others come and bought round
us, if I could borrow the
money secured on the land -
at 4 or 5 per cent - I should like
to do so -

My wife is well & I
left the station -
I hope my mother is much better
The season has been very dry -
I nearly caught a severe cold when
in Australia and have not got rid
of it yet. The mail is closing -
The City of Sydney sails this evening -
