My dear Mother

I have not had letters  
from you for three months  
I am not about returning to  
the north - I have sold what  
my father called and what  
we have every appearance  
of a bad season. The dust  
has been flying about Adelaide  
I should try it with care  
The price of wheat has  
fallen very low but has taken  
a considerable rise -

I should say it was here but  
I don't know

We have a great many people  
in our foot we have only  
one more day. I do not  
know what makes the  
people come here. I suppose  
they are taken by the  
sawdust - there may be  
many more that would  
be with the water -  
at present they are hidden  
between us  
Adelaide is a place I do  
not like

I have received several letters  
from Brown & Co. I wish to let you  
know that the wool is shipped from  
Portland this year  
we have a fine season in our  
part of the country in my own  
socks as ever

I wish to thank you a short  
time ago enquiring about  
some names in Ed. with  
them a list of names taken  
then comes over  
with the Wind Lane to the  
at Home  
nothing new
