I received your letter of May 15th & when in your way home will try to get you a train for £2.50.00 at 7 1/2 or 8 o'clock for five guineas - which I hope you will find a saving.

I wish that the wool to your order which will be about 1000 000 of washed wool - the wool to be shipped from Portland - I wish to be found from the same source - you will please let me know who the wool is to be shipped from.

I have a great deal of wool in the way of the wide grain - I wish to have 1000 more to show you for it was very clean - and good quality - If you get it and if you wish to order with what hat should I order

export to sea from June 1 - 1849  
up to Aug 30 1850 - renders at 8/11  
per ton at £30. with fine £  
one \$110.00

The expenses of the shipping in

more to cattle than I have done.

have 1300 head on the station  
good fat cattle with always  
in the winter in the autumn  
I can make better use of  
wheat and salt for sheep  
I am a large quantity of  
a part of the money I wish you
