You that His Excellency has
received a Despatch in reply
from Lord Glenelg commencing
his Lordship's satisfaction at
the honorable testimony borne
to your merits and abilities
and remarking that a copy
of the Lieutenant General's
Report having been transmitted
to the General Commanding
in Chief Lord Hill has been
pleased to express his gratification
at receiving such honorable
testimony of your conduct and
has stated, that he will not
hesitate to give his sanction
to your continuance in your
present station, without
prejudice to your promotion in
the 21st Regiment, for such a
period as may be thought
desirable

desirable for the public service but
His Lordship has at the same
time intimated, that he cannot
consistently with what is due to
the claims of others recommend
you for the rank of Major.

It being therefore impossible
to recommend you in the manner
most agreeable to yourself Lord
Glenely has recommended to
the Lords Commissioners of the
Treasury that with a view to
return your services your salary
should be increased to £500
per annum and with their
Lordships concurrence the Secretary
of State has authorized the
Lieutenant General to issue
to you an annual salary of
that amount on the understanding
that the addition of your
present pay is specially granted
to yourself and is not to be
considered

considered as the permanent order
of letters to the Commandant
of Somerset Prison,
