I have been so
 busy lately that I have ^{not} ~~never~~

 than short notes. I
 have lately had the
 most tremendous "cases"
 I have ever received
 during my legal career.
 Briefly the facts are
 these; - I intrusted a

Case to ~~go~~ Frick to
draw pleadings & ~~and~~
Employed him at the
Trial. wh he conducted
with ability. The trial
lasted 3 days & resulted
in our getting a verdict
with fair damages (The
action was agst the city
of South Melbourne for
nuisance in ^{or rather cutting down} levelling
a street, - defence, statutory
authority) The Defts did
not appear or during the
Trial Except to our pleadings

but at the close of the case &
immediately before summing up Williams
& intimated that he doubted whether the
Jt. Ct. recover on the pleadings & that he
had reserved the questions to the findings of the
jury for the Full Ct. - All the material
questions were answered in our favor.

An argument before the Full Ct,
Williams, who led them by the nose,
