My dear Andrew,

 above address that we have  
 moved again & I sincerely  
 hope that our migrations  
 have ceased for some time to  
 come. I've been & am  
 still very busy & my leisure  
 has been occupied by  
 unpacking & fixing up  
 furniture &c and for some time  
 to come I shall be thus  
 busily occupied - At present  
 I have only time to reply  
 very briefly to yours of  
 9<sup>th</sup> inst. I have seen Farness  
 & Parrall. They inform me

That they sent you the  
Certificates required on 9th  
inst. I have obtained &  
posted you the additional  
Certificate. I called on  
Mullen & asked for the  
original. As I anticipated  
they said they had not got  
it. "Sure?" said I. "Quite  
sure" was the reply. "It's  
not in your Catalogue is  
it?" "No" - I showed them  
the Catalogue & after  
some delay the Book was  
unearthed. It has been  
sent to Messrs. George  
Robertson as instructed  
& I suppose you will receive  
it by the mail which
