the children, & tell them
I sent it. Remember
me affectionately to your
noble 'boys' - whom I shall
never forget, and to Mr.
Johnston. I shall write
to you again but cannot
say when or where.
I read the 'flings' in the
Lancaster paper. I have
enough of such here. But
with a good conscience I
have managed to gather 9 lbs.
of flesh since I left
