Calliuncus vulsus nom. nov. (Opiliones).

In Vol. 92, page 53, of the Papers and Proceedings of this Society, published in 1958, I described under the name Calliuncus glaber a new Tasmanian harvestman. Prof. Dr. C. F. Roewer has kindly drawn my attention to the fact that H. Kauri (1954, p. 7) has given the name Calliuncus glabra to a harvestman from South-West Australia. The word "glabra", however, is incorrectly formed and must be changed to "glaber", thus causing the name for the Tasmanian species to be preoccupied. Hence it becomes necessary for a new name to be given to the Tasmanian form and I therefore propose the name Calliuncus vulsus.

The two species differ from each other in the armature of the femur of the pedipalp.
