The Mean in all cases is taken from the sums of the three daily registers,

and not from the maximum and minimum. The direction of the wind is registered from currents moving at a height of 192 feet, and the force according to Lind's Wind Guage. The supposition, however, of an uniform velocity during the month is a very arbitrary one, and the results can be considered only approximately correct.

The relations of the quantities of rain which fell under the different winds are registered each evening at sundown.

The twenty-five years' standard tables are used for obtaining the difference from the average.

NOTE.—The Colchicum flowered ten days later this year than last; the Hornbean, Golden Drop Plum, Horsechesnut, Oak, Chrysanthemum, and Black Mulberry were also from seven to ten days later, but Coe's Red Plum ripened eight days earlier.
