Royal Society of Tasmania.

The annual meeting of the Fellows of the Royal Society of Tasmania was held on July 9, 1907. Mr. A. G. Webster presided, and there was a fair attendance. The report and balance-sheet were presented by the Sec. Mr. Robert Gould was elected a Fellow of the society.

The Chairman moved the adoption of the report and balance-sheet, and stated that the Council had under consideration the question of revising the rules, and a special general meeting would be called to consider the recommendations.

Mr. Russell Young seconded, and in the discussion which followed on the affairs of the society, Mr. E. L. Piesse suggested that more should be spent on the publishing of the proceedings of the society, and greater efforts made to secure new members.

The motion was agreed to.

There being no other nominations, the retiring members of Council, Sir Elliott Lewis, Messrs. A. G. Webster, R. Young, and R. M. Johnston were re-elected.
