The receipt of a work by L. C. D. van Dijk, entitled "*Mededeelingen uit het Oost-Indisch Archief, No. 1. Twee Togten naar de Golf van Carpentaria*," enables me to withdraw the hypothesis which I advanced regarding the date of the discovery of d'Edel's Land in the volume for 1885, p. 407. The d'Edel of 1617 was a Cornelis d'Edel, whose abortive voyage was quite distinct from that of 1619, in which his brother Jacob d'Edel, with the ship (*'t Wapen van (?) Amsterdam*), fell in with the west coast of Australia in 32½deg. S. lat. (July 19) (bl. vii.-viii.)

Lauts informs us that Carstens (1623) named the Gulf of Carpentaria in honour of the Governor (Landvoogd) of that name. *Nederlanders in Indië*, bl. 214.
