WHEREAS

Thomas James No. 719
per Ship John (2), was on the Sixth
Day of April 184, duly convicted before
W. H. Briston Esquire & another ^(two of them) Esquire, was of His Majesty's
Justice of the Peace, acting in and for the said Island and its Dependencies, of

Absconding
and sentenced to be kept to Hard Labour for
Two Years (One of which in Chains)

which sentence the Lieutenant-Governor has confirmed and directed the same be
carried into effect at Port Arthur and conducted
to be repeated

NOW these are therefore to require you, the said Constable, ^{and Commandant of said Prison} to convey and deliver
the body of the said Thomas James

to the Superintendent of the Convicts
at Port Arthur and you, the said Superintendent,

are hereby required to receive him into your custody to be dealt with according
to the said sentence, ^{and Order} for which this shall be to you a sufficient Warrant and
Authority.
