THIS INDENTURE made the *Seventeenth* day of

February One thousand nine hundred and two BETWEEN THE

COUNCIL OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TASMANIA of the one part and ----

WILLIAM HENRY WILLIAMS of Hobart in Tasmania Master of Arts of

the other part WHEREAS The University of Tasmania was duly ----

constituted as a body politic and corporate by an Act of the

Parliament of Tasmania 53 Victoria No. 41 intituled "The ----

Tasmanian University Act" AND WHEREAS the said Council of the

University under the powers conferred upon it by the said Act

and in conformity with the Statutes of the said University has

resolved to appoint the said William Henry Williams as Professor

in the University of Tasmania in the subjects of Classics and

English Literature for the period of three years from the first

day of January One thousand nine hundred and two at the salary

and subject to the covenants and conditions hereinafter ----

mentioned and contained NOW THIS INDENTURE WITNESSETH that

the Council of the University of Tasmania doth hereby nominate

constitute and appoint the said William Henry Williams a ----

Professor in the University of Tasmania in the subjects of ----

Classics and English Literature for the term of three years

from the first day of January One thousand nine hundred and

two AND IT IS HEREBY covenanted agreed and declared by and

between the parties hereto that the said William Henry Williams

shall be paid by the University the yearly income or stipend of

five hundred pounds during his said engagement payable by equal

monthly payments on the first day of every month such payments

having been duly made up to the first day of February instant

AND shall also be paid fees on a scale to be fixed by the said Council for acting as Examiner as mentioned in the Schedule hereto together with reasonable expenses necessarily incurred by the said William Henry Williams when he shall be absent from Hobart in the performance of such duties as are set forth in the said Schedule AND THAT the said William Henry Williams shall be entitled to such periods of vacation and at such times as the said Council may appoint such periods of vacation to amount in the whole to not less than three calendar months in every year AND the said William Henry Williams hereby covenants with the said Council of the University that he will during the term of his engagement faithfully and to the best of his ability do and perform the duties of such Professor as aforesaid as set forth in the Schedule hereto AND will during his said ----- engagement devote the whole of his time during term exclusively to and for the benefit of the University and as such Professor as aforesaid and will not during the term of his engagement accept any other engagement and shall not engage in private --- tuition nor (except with the express permission in writing of the Council) be engaged in or connected with or concerned in any other business or pursuit whatsoever AND WILL not during the term of his engagement become a candidate for or accept a seat in any Parliament or Legislature or become a member of any political association AND WILL in the event of his being at any time absent from the discharge of his duties immediately report such absence in writing to the Vice Chancellor ----- PROVIDED ALWAYS that if the said Council shall at any time grant leave of absence to the said William Henry Williams under any Regulations for the time being in force or shall grant

temporary leave of absence to him in the event of his being
incapacitated by sickness or any other cause from the discharge
of his duty it shall be lawful for the said Council to appoint
a substitute to act in his stead such substitute to receive
such portion of the salary of the said William Henry Williams
during the absence of the said William Henry Williams as the
said Council shall direct PROVIDED ALSO that the appointment

hereby made may at the expiration of the second year of the
term or period of three years hereinbefore mentioned be with
the consent of both parties hereto extended upon the terms and
conditions of this appointment except this present clause for a
further term or period of two years from the expiration of the
said term of three years first hereinbefore mentioned IN

WITNESS whereof the said Council hath caused to be hereunto
affixed the Common Seal of the said University and the said
William Henry Williams hath hereunto set his hand and seal the

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO

The duties to be performed by the said William Henry Williams as such Professor as aforesaid shall be as follows:-

1. To give Lectures on subjects of the University course in Classics and English Literature to day or evening classes in Hobart and Launceston at such times as may be required by the Council -----
2. To assist in directing the work of Candidates for Degrees or Examinations in Arts in subjects of the University course for which no special instruction is provided -----
3. To assist in supervising Examinations conducted by the University and to act as Examiner in such Examinations as may be required by the Council -----
4. To attend Meetings of the Council or of Committees of the Council when required to advise upon University matters -----
5. To act as a member of the Board of Studies the Faculty of Letters and the Professorial Board and to assist in the performance of the duties of such Boards and Faculty as prescribed by the Statutes and Regulations for the time being of the University and to attend all Meetings of such Boards and Faculty and of the Senate of the University unless prevented by illness or other reasonable cause of absence -----
