My dear Sir

I received your letter this morning

As I have no one that will come forward to assist me – I have been the whole of this day occupied in writing to my creditors – which letters I have sent by horses – on their reply depends whether I shall declare myself insolvent – having a moderate dividend to pay – I do not expect to be so much favoured as Mr Manley – who has paid nothing yet is reestablished in his old farm as I am told -
