

Hawkridge 26 Aug 1844

My dear Sir -

I have been greatly disappointed at not receiving any reply to my letter stating that Mr Swan had kindly offered to join in trust of my Estate with you – In addition to what I then stated – Mr Swan informs me there would be no risk run by you – and the expences occurred by any journey or else would be taken from the Estate

I thought that you might have written to Mr Priaulx to know whether he consented – but as I mentioned to you before he does consent –

As regards myself (as I feel certain I should do my best) I can have no objection – but I own I do not think it necessary to be put in trust – I hope however that any dislike you may have to that office – will be done away with by the consideration that you render me essential service – I am at present so worn out by uncertainty that I scarcely know what I do or ought to do –

Mr Swan I believe intends to write to you he will be at my house to night not being able to come out on Friday Evg -
