The Council was informed by the Sects had procured a quantity of Plants to send to England. They were coming up in one of the Coasting Vessels from Swaz. The payment of £1. 8. to Mr. Platt for printing 1000 circulars was authorized.

The ^{next} meeting of the Society for 18. 15. 9. being to the amount of expenses to self & Miss for month of October, was authorized also the Secretary's salary of 16s. 6d. for month of October.

The Council considered it would be unwise to form the Circulars for the 1st meet^s - as most members could not attend owing to a variety of circumstances & it would be wiser to adjourn the meet^s until next week.

The consideration of the amount to be allotted for each prize award at the Nat. Show was gone into & result was as follows -

The Society was directed to obtain 2 more wood cases to send to Norfolk Island for plants. The Sects informed the meet^s it would be acceptable to commence collecting the plants that were to be sent by the Calcutta & that the Secretary should be given the East Coast to procure the plants & other plants at the Council agreed to
