with whom my son was staying at Quamby had
sent him on some business, previous to my son's
leaving for New Zealand - where he has since been -

The Australian papers assure me that my publications
have been scrippled - although a few individuals
seem inclined to accuse me of self interest in
trying to "impose" on public credulity" whereas I
have never sought a farthing in recompense for the
serious expenses I have been put to for 4 years in
warming all the Coast just before period of

extreme disturbance (-I have just done so in
preparation for 30th Inst. - &c (see my enclosed
lett.)

Your contributions of weather registry are
peculiarly acceptable, and I thank you much
for them - and shall be glad of others if not
giving too much trouble - To one of your Society
I need not say more than that many lives have
been already saved by my warnings -
