I must apologise for

Subscription to Anti Slavery of Scotland
- On looking into the matter
I find that everything has
been done quite correctly -

Your name was duly forwarded
to the Anti Slavery of Edinburgh
for 1861 - & will go by next mail
for 1862 - so that you will please
consider our letter of Jan'y last
as altogether cancelled - it was
written under misapprehension

which arose from our Book-keeper
fancying he had discovered
that you had paid a subscription
to the Anti-Slavery of London for
1861 - which had not been
forwarded - hence in our
desire to rectify the matter
as early as possible we sent
you a receipt for the London
Anti-Slavery for 1862 - This
receipt will of course now
be transferred to some one
else - as we presume you
do not wish to subscribe
to the London Anti-Slavery -
We trust you will quite
understand that no mission

whenever has occurred & that
you will be duly entitled to
all the Privileges offered by
the Intelligence Society to its
Regular Subscribers -

We enclose a Memo. of your
acc. which leaves as you say
1/- to your Cr.

With reference to the Intelligence
we duly post every month ~~and~~
a copy directed to yourself &
to Dr Henry Cotton, directed as
per enclosed slips - for the future
we will add "George" to Dr
Cotton's address - kind direct
