Hop feast at Lisdillon in front of the house were tables made of long boards on tressels, & forms brought from the School House and other made. Some men asked to sing & one called Shaw sang "Oh! But my love he was killed in the wa-ar" – Others joined the chorus – Mark S.M. & Frederick Shaw talk by the table behind – Margaret Jennings with hair in sausage rolls & was called "Moggie" was the first to be married in Swansea, Church of England that is on the hill now 1922 & was Mrs Regan. They went to Sydney, N.S.Wales, he died but she lives now, ie 1922. She was very fat & threw her arms round me before the cab man who brought me a long round when he was close by, and kissed me & said "My mother's dear old friend!- Mrs Jennings of Rocky Hills, Penal Station was her mother. Miss Clara Luttrall, Nellie M Mitchell & self were returning from Norfolk Is. 1910. Mrs Allen had Lisdillon State School, & Mary Allen taught years & years ago.
