

A Testimony of a Monthly Meeting 11th mo 1884 from Rathmell

We have now to record the death of our dear friend Robert Andrew Mallies, which took place ^{very suddenly on the 17th ultimus} at his own house in Murray Street, very suddenly on the 17th ultimus. He was ^{amongst} the first in this colony who joined the Society, from conviction at its establishment upwards of 50 years ago, and has for many years filled the position of overseer.

~~He was~~ Born in London on the 17th of the 8th month 1815 and came ^{with his parents in 1822} to this Island, then called Van Dieman's Land, with his parents in 1822 and he remained here until 1837, when he removed to Sydney where he resided six years; assisting in the formation of the Society there, and holding the office of Clerk to the Monthly Meeting.

His life had been active in religious and philanthropic efforts — almost continually was he going about doing good to the souls and bodies of his fellow men; and was a means of great usefulness in connection with the charitable institutions of the city. But while thus engaged he was of a most retiring disposition and was unwilling that his services should at any time become the subject of comment, being desirous that all the praise and all the glory should be ascribed to ~~him~~ ^{the God} ~~and~~ ^{had given} ability for his name sake giving the ability to one who had enabled ~~me~~, so weak as he had felt to ~~make~~ himself to be, to do anything for his name's sake — remarking that it is not by works of righteousness that we have done, but according to His mercy He saveth us, by the washing of regeneration and the renewing of the Holy Ghost. And thus having said he endeavoured faithfully to do the will of God, and to serve his generation, he fell asleep.

The funeral took place on first day morning the 19th instant, ~~at~~ ^{and} which there was a large attendance of all classes of the public. There ~~was~~ ^{at the} a solemn meeting ~~at~~ the grave side the Silence was broken by several friends, one of whom gave expression to the words: — "Thanks be unto God which giveth us the victory — thanks be unto God which gave him the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."
