THE COUNCIL have the pleasure of notifying that they have arranged with Miss GIBLIN, whose School has long been favorably known in Hobart, to join the staff of the Ladies' College in the capacity of Vice-Principal from the commencement of the ensuing term.

They have to announce that Miss KNOTT, having decided on returning to England, has tendered her resignation as Principal. Steps have already been taken for securing the agency of Miss BRALE, Principal of the Cheltenham Ladies' College, in the selection and appointment of a successor to Miss KNOTT, and of a qualified assistant in the place of Miss FANNY KNOTT, who is also returning to England. The BISHOP has kindly undertaken to co-operate with Miss BRALE, and the negotiations will be finally completed as soon as he reaches England, in order that the new Principal and Assistant Teacher may arrive in Hobart by the end of the year.

While regretting the approaching severance of their relations with Miss KNOTT, to whose unwearied zeal and ability the success of the College has been mainly due, the Council may confidently express their belief that the present high standard of efficiency will continue to be satisfactorily maintained under the new arrangements.
