My dear Anna Maria -

A few lines of thy kind. cordial
word, have been very acceptable - but
dear Joseph and Rachel have been worked
and thoughtful as to write me generally on
some subjects. and kept me posted up
I did write a little letter, and found today
J. J. never to post for now as I was leaving
Sydney for Campbell Town, and he says that
he duly posted it: that would inform thereof
my movements and that ungracious Master
had so far mollified the hearts of men, as
not all with blushing feelings so reluctantly
to retrace their steps for the post. whenever
they deviated from the strict order of the footpath.
The meeting was solemn, and best help was
near - so that I think the better part of which
many had drunk, was blessed rather. No
cheering path present, as usually joyous but
gloomy, afterward it produces the peculiar
fruits of uprightness rather than of course
thereby: and I trust the such as saw the
experience of that little section of the Church
here. I was there with a brother and friend
Davy, and there was kindly and attentively

recovered. I think she was suffering from
congestion of the liver produced by cold - and I
had indigestion. Melancholy & tension with.
After adopting the remedies of a sister of an
apothecary here I obtained Bleeding Powder and took

morning - got to Sydney about past ten -
crowded meeting at dawn and a good time
good meeting with afternoon - in the evening
met a Tee Party at Hammett P. Gardner's
of course that's connected or knows to friends
our party which ended in a meeting -
Dr Cox was the best to us throughout yesterday
then I think I may in deep gratitude say
that all the meetings were heavenly -
and I hoped for a release for further service
were such the divine will - but I cannot
yet see my way home - the Lord is indeed
good - very good to me - far above what
words can convey - and He will release
me at the right time. I don't think that
He will keep me here much longer but
then dearest He has been showing me a
prospect of just translation of his vocation
well - his wife ludovic - saith my soul it
is all right. He who has purchased me

persecuted us by his own precious blood
has ought to dispose of us so seemly the
best - "Be thou faithful unto death": and
then there is all eternity after that and
the balm comforteth - "Thy will be done"
may we always be enabled heartily to
adopt that language and may our hearts
be always filled with the love of God.

I hear a sad letter from a young man who
left his kind parents in Ireland enatiff
and shipped as a seaman - I shriked when
I mentioned him in my last - The poor
fellow has been sick with it, and I trust
through the mercy of God brought when down
I intend to enclose his letter to me received
only this day - I do hope that he has put
down the rest feelings of his heart. But
certainly the troubles he alund has were
ones of great power.

I am obliged to write hasty - the post
closes at half past 3 - and I cannot do
more than scribble a few words by letter
now - Forwards however I hope our
lives over moral perdition. May the Lord
support them in all thy trials.
